I wish to further endorse my huge reservations for a further 100 houses to be built by adding the following observations.

In this year alone we have seen the approval of 52 houses in lower Bartestree, a further 40 + approved on the main A438 in Bartestree and 6 properties already built in Longworth Lane, not to mention I believe another 40 or so houses approved in the adjoining village of Lugwardine.

And now with horror we, the residents of Bartestree are being asked to accept another 100 houses.

- 1 The village school cannot cope with an increase of numbers. Their building is too small and there is very little room for expansion.
- 2. The Crossroads at A438/Longworth Lane is dangerous now I dread to think with the increase of traffic what will happen.
- 3. Sewerage & street lighting is totally inadequate.
- 4. The field area/orchard a wonderful habitat for many creatures would be destroyed.
- 5. The village facilities are limited to one small shop and hairdressers no doctors /dental surgery, no Post Office, no Pub, no garage, limited public transport.
- 6. Longworth Lane is narrow and unsuitable for heavy traffic.

Whilst I accept that more housing is needed, I feel strongly that our village of Bartestree have had their fair share of applications approved. Any more will erode away the character and scenery, natural beauty of the area.

I hope that common sense will prevail when the inquiry takes place and that the planning application will be rejected once and for all.
