It is proposed to take the tree down so that a 12ft stem is left for two reasons; one for wildlife, two to continue the link between the tree and the house name (Lone Pine). No replanting is proposed as the stem will be left in situ, also the location of the tree is deemed unsuitable for a replacement tree to be replanted as would also outgrow its position and cause issues with the gas tank and road. 6.
