I refer to the above application and would make the following comments in relation to contaminated land and human health issues from previous site uses only.

"Geological, hydrogeological and hydrological Impacts Assessment. Land at Whitwick Manor, Lower Eggleton, Herefordshire. HR8 2UE." Prepared by Oaktree Environmental Ltd., Version 1.3, Dated 10/08/2022, ref:2102-003-E

The development site, whilst seemingly largely unaffected by potential significant sources of contamination, does include some areas of previously developed land. Taking into consideration the context of what's proposed and the conclusions of the contaminated land risk assessment part of the above report, I would recommend the following condition which considers the unforeseen be appended to any approval.

Recommended condition

"If during the course of the development unexpected contamination not previously identified is found to be present at the site then the work shall be stopped and no further development shall be carried out unless or until the developer has submitted a written method statement to be approved in writing by the local planning authority. The method statement shall include details about how the unexpected contamination shall be dealt with. Thereafter the development of the site will be carried out in accordance with the appropriate method statement.

Reason: In the interests of human health and to comply with policy SD1 of the Herefordshire Local Plan – Core Strategy and the National Planning Policy Framework. "
