- If you are aggrieved by the decision of the local planning authority to refuse Listed Building Consent or Conservation Area Consent for the
 proposed works, or to grant consent subject to conditions, you may appeal to the Secretary of State in accordance with Sections 20 and
 21 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.
- If you want to appeal, then you must do so within 6 months of the date of this notice, using a form which you can get from The Planning Inspectorate, Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol, BS1 6PN.
- The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.

Purchase Notices

If Listed Building Consent or Conservation Area Consent is refused, or granted subject to conditions, whether by the local planning
authority or by the Secretary of State, and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in
its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any works which have been or would
be permitted, he may serve on the Council a purchase notice requiring that Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with
the provisions of Section 32 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.
