The following is a comment on application **P222728/N** by '**Rebecca Johnson**'

Nature of feedback: objecting_to_the_application

Comment:

Planning application 222728.

I am deeply concerned about the detrimental effects of the proposed anaerobic digester (Whitwick Manor) on the local environment, local infrastructure, potential health hazards and increased air and water pollution. There will be noise pollution both from the increased traffic and from the structure itself, which is a worrying prospect.

There will be increased traffic on A roads, including past our local nursery and infant school, which would pose an unnecessary risk in both the amount of large vehicles and the resultant reduction in air quality. This is extremely concerning.

The proposed structure would also increase the amount of ammonia in the air - in an area where ammonia is already 1.5 x higher than the recommended limit. Ammonia increases the risk of asthma and other heart / lung conditions, and restricts the growth of some plants. This is very concerning.

The technology that is proposed for the AD is untested and may make pollution worse if it does not work as hoped. In addition, siting industrial-scale waste disposal in open countryside is contrary to national planning policy. This is deeply concerning.

Please do not grant this structure planning permission. I am concerned that its effects on the environment and residents will be entirely deleterious.
