confess to find the application somewhat confusing. The Footpath Plan, Drwn. 01211-00-~D depicts an area in Red outline, this is the normal convention for the area of proposed development?, if so, would appear to form an obstruction of the registered footpath ZK22.

The Letter of support states, whichever route of the path, and my understandings the <u>second plan</u> is the legal line of the registered path according to my copy of the definitive map, the proposals would not affect either route?, yet I have received representations from a member of the public in comparatively recent times, the existing development forms an Obstruction of the public path.

In answer to question 6 of your Authority application Format, indicates NO legal diversion is requisite to allow the proposed development, which appears contrary to the Red Outline on the plan.

Would yourself please be so Kind as to check these matters out with 'the public rights of way dept', as a public right of way is a material consideration that must be taken into account at the planning stage. IF to be I am correct that the proposed development (Red Outline) would create an obstruction, in the absence of any proposals for a Legal Diversion, leaves no other option than to make a Formal Objection to the application, Thank You in these matters.
