#### Inspiration and Form

The above precedent images and character images across illustrate the architectural aspiration of the scheme to create a building that is sympathetic to the rich traditional heritage of the Hereford area but also creates its own contemporary identity. By analysing existing architectural character, materials, vernacular and styles, we are able to reinterpret key traditional features in a contemporary fashion through tone, variation in detailing and simplicity.

By introducing contemporary tones and articulation, some of the key character of the area are celebrated and embraced within the architecture through subtle details such as the double soldier course above openings and brick dentil patterns.






















### Character and Appearance

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


