Thank you for your letter of 16 July 2021 regarding the above application for planning permission. On the basis of the information available to date, we offer the following advice to assist your authority in determining the application.

Historic England Advice

The proposal is for the replacement of an existing collection of barns with a new barn occupying the same footprint and to a similar height as the existing barns.

It is located within 60m of the scheduled monument known as 'Three moated sites at The Hyde and Lower Hyde' (National Heritage List for England 1019854). Archaeological remains associated with the moated site at The Hyde will extend beyond the scheduled area, but their exact extent is not well understood.

We are satisfied that the proposed location is already disturbed by the construction and use of the existing barns and that the scale of the replacement barn is in keeping with the existing farm complex. We therefore have no objection on heritage grounds to this proposal.

We recommend that any new stormwater soakaway provision required is located to the west of the proposed barn to minimise the risk of incidental harm to archaeological remains associated with the scheduled monument.

We recommend that you seek the views of your archaeological adviser regarding the scheme and any archaeological mitigation during this development.
